Basket Creation

Ribbons of Hope

Lead-Up to the Event

A lot of prep work goes into making *Ribbons of Hope* a success! Volunteers assist in:

- Mailing invitations.
- Setting up *Basket Central* and sorting inventory.
- Organizing supplies and ensuring baskets are event-ready.
- Time Commitment: Various shifts in the weeks prior to the event.

Solicit for Donations

Help secure donations for *Ribbons of Hope* by reaching out to businesses, friends, and community members. Prizes for baskets, gift cards, and monetary donations are all needed.

- **Skills Needed:** Communication, networking, and outreach.
- Time Commitment: Ongoing throughout the year.

Event Day Volunteer Roles

On the big day, many hands are needed to ensure everything runs smoothly. Roles include:

- **Loading & Transporting:** Load baskets on trucks for the move to the venue.
- **Set-Up Crew:** Adorn tables with programs, decorations, and prepare the event space.
- **Raffle Team:** Sell raffle tickets and line up baskets for distribution.
- Guest Assistance: Help direct hallway traffic and assist attendees.
- **Clean-Up Crew:** Pack up inventory and supplies at the end of the evening.

- Time Commitment: Event day (various shifts available).

Pink Bow Project

Each year, volunteers handcraft and distribute large pink bows throughout Hillsborough, Flemington and Raritan in honor of Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

How it Works

In September, Pink Bow Project supplies are picked up by volunteers, with bow assembly taking place at their own home and at their own pace. Exact date TBD.

- **Supply Pick-up:** Pick up supplies at Joanne Licovitz's office: Coldwell Banker Realty, 716 US-206, Hillsborough Township, NJ 08844.
- **Distribution:** Volunteers distribute bows to assigned businesses.
- October: Towns are fully decorated!
- Skills Needed: Basic crafting (cutting, folding, and twisting pipe cleaners).
- Materials: Provided to volunteers at pick-up.
- Time Commitment: Light schedule throughout September.

Tie the Town Pink

Since its launch in 2016, this initiative has expanded to **46 towns** across New Jersey to raise breast cancer awareness by displaying pink ribbons throughout local municipalities.

Volunteers help by:

- Box Assembly: Help assemble the boxes (2-3 volunteers needed for approx. 2 hours)
- **Box Pick-up**: Pick up assembled boxes at Joanne Liscovitz's office: Coldwell Banker Realty, 716 US-206, Hillsborough Township, NJ 08844.
- **Delivery**: Deliver boxes to the township clerk at a participating town's municipal building during last week of September, Mon thru Fr 10-4pm
- Location: Various NJ towns.
- Time Commitment: 1-2 hours depending on distance to town
